5. Whenever your permanent address is changed, it is important that you notify all concerned, using the inclosed Personal Report form.





SUBJECT: Classification Questionnaire of Reserve
Officers (W.D., A.G.O. Form No. 178)

To: All Reserve Officers.

1. The Secretary of War has directed that the armed forces be brought to the greatest practical state of efficiency for national defense.

2. The War Department is accordingly making a survey of the individual qualifications of each officer in order that his services can be used to the best advantage in time of a national emergency. While it is not contemplated that reassignments will be made, it is necessary that all records be reviewed.

3. As a first step in this survey, it is necessary that the data as to the civilian occupations and experience of each Reserve officer be brought up-to-date. You are, therefore, requested to fill out the attached questionnaire IN TRIPLICATE WITHOUT DELAY and return it in the inclosed envelope, not directly to this office but to the office from which you received the blank questionnaire.

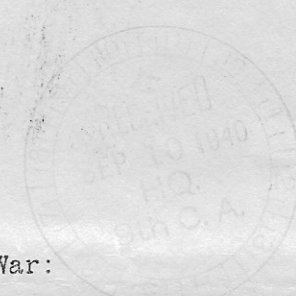

Subject: Extended Active Duty.

To : All Reserve Officers, Third Military Area.

1. Public Resolution No. 96, 76th Congress, approved August 27, 1940, Authorizes the President to order into the active military service, for a period of not to exceed one year, any or all reserve components of the Army of the United States, for the strengthening of the national defense.

2. The War Department considers some form of compulsory selective service and training as essential to our system of national defense at this time, and believes it equally essential that the National Guard and a large number of Reserve officers be given additional training and assist the Regular Army in training men inducted under the selective service law.

3. The Present plans of the War Department include:

a. The ordering of the National Guard into the federal service by successive increments.


b. The ordering of Reserve officers to extended active duty as required.

c. The prompt registration of all men within the age limits prescribed, followed by the selection and induction of about four hundred thousand men for training and service commencing October 16, 1940.

4. These plans will require a large number of Reserve officers. In general, those qualified Reserve officers who can accept extended active duty without undue personal hardship will be the first to be ordered to such duty.

5. You are requested, therefore, to immediately advise this office whether there are any important reasons why you should not be ordered to extended active duty immediately. If so, please state your reasons for deferment of service, and the amount of delay considered necessary. A form for this purpose and a return envelope are enclosed. Please complete this form and return without delay.

a. Hayfever, severe and incapacitating.


2. You are advised that you may make an appeal to appear before a Medical Appeal Board at your expense, if not on active duty. In considering appeals, the Medical Board will limit its examination to the disqualifying defects above. The nearest Medical Appeal Board is located at Fort Douglas, Utah.

3. It is desired that you submit a statement in QUADRUPLICATE showing whether you do or do not wish to make an appeal in this case. Forms for this purpose are inclosed herewith. It is necessary that all copies be signed, and returned to this office not later than January 30, 1942.

4. If you do not wish to appeal your case, statement is desired as to whether you desire transfer to the Inactive Reserve or honorable discharge from the Officers' Reserve Corps.



1. Orders are being issued calling you to active duty for a period of one year effective January 15, 1942 or not later than Jan. 20, 1942, providing you are physically qualified, for duty at FA Replacement Training Center, Camp Roberts, California. Formal orders will be mailed you upon receipt of qualified physical examination.

2. In the event orders are not received in time to permit obtaining Government transportation, if desired, you may apply for transportation to the Quartermaster, Fort Douglas, Utah, accompanied by three (3) copies of this letter. The travel directed is necessary in the military service and is chargeable to FD 1499 P1-06 A 0410-2 and 3 QM 1601 P61-07 A 0525-2 and 3.

3. This information is furnished you to enable you to arrange your affairs before reporting for active duty.

4. It is requested that you secure final type physical examination at once at not later than Jan. 7, 1942 at Ft. Douglas, Utah. You should report between 8:30 and 9:00 A.M. at the Station Hospital on any week day. No expense to the Government will be incurred.

5. Immediate acknowledgment of receipt of this communication is desired, with the date you expect to report at or did report at Fort Douglas, Utah for the examination.

6. If physical examination has been secured in compliance with letter this headquarters dated December 26 or 27th, 1941, it will not be necessary for you to secure another examination; however, this office is to be advised of the dated same was secured.


